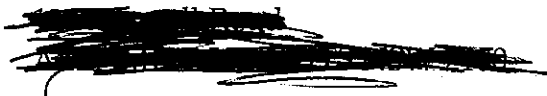

The Premier has received your further letter concerning your allegations of corruption and improper conduct within the NSW Police Force.

I note that you have raised your concerns directly with the former Minister for Police, the Hon J A Watkins MP, and that your allegations have been investigated by the Northern Beaches Local Area Command.

Your letter indicates that you have already approached the Ombudsman, the Police Integrity Commission (PIC) and the Inspector of the PIC, and that you will be contacting the Joint Parliamentary Committee on the Office of the Ombudsman and the PIC.

As this matter concerns the administration of the Minister for Police, the Hon D A Campbell MP, I have arranged for your further correspondence to be brought to the Minister's attention.


The Attorney General has asked me to reply to your letter referred by the Premier about an incident that occurred at the Surf Rock Hotel, Collaroy on 9 April 2006.

I have reviewed the correspondence and newspaper articles from the Manly Daily you enclosed. The Attorney General cannot intervene in decisions made by the courts or become involved in criminal proceedings. It is the police who are responsible for investigating criminal conduct and it is the police who decide whether there is sufficient evidence to prosecute and lay charges.

THEN they have too much power!
I also advise that the Attorney General has no jurisdiction to deal with police issues or to investigate complaints against police officers. The NSW Ombudsman, has the power to investigate your allegations of police corruption and improper conduct. I note that you have approached the Ombudsman, the Police Integrity Commission and the Independent Commission Against Corruption about your concerns. *incompetent*

Thank you for bringing your concerns to the attention of the Attorney General and I return the tape you enclosed.

At long last I obtained a copy of the transcript of my trial and have trimmed 1500 pages into 90. These 90 pages prove a number of things categorically and without doubt

Please do me the courtesy of reading them, these are the final pieces of a complex puzzle that has threatened to tear my life apart

You will not hear from me again
