Photo a jury didn't see

Bouncer did this to Shane

THIS sickening photo — kept secret by a Sydney court — shows the shocking injuries that can be inflicted by brutal bouncers.

It shows bloodied and bruised Shane Bullock in hospital with a broken nose and fractured eye socket after being bashed by a security guard at the Surf Rock Hotel in Collaroy.

Other pictures of Mr Bullock's mangled face are too horrific to be published. They were not allowed as evidence in a trial in case the harrowing images unduly influenced the jury.

The photos, obtained by *The Daily Telegraph* in a special investigation into pub violence, come amid revelations a Sydney man was bashed at the same Gold Coast strip club as Manly surfer Samuel

The attacks highlight the entrenched culture among security and crowd control guards to act above the law.
A District Court jury this month found bouncer Dirk Nierop, 45, guilty of assaulting Mr Bullock but not guilty of maliciously inflicting grievous bodily harm with intent. He will be sentenced on April 27.

Mr Bullock is now considering further legal action against the club and other bouncers involved in the April 2006 incident.
"It's about time something like this was put on the front page because bouncers need to pay for what they do," he said.

"This guy nearly got off and the charges were even down-graded. I

to shut up and go away," Mr Jewell said.
"I stepped outside for a cigarette and was told I was too drunk to be let back in

"I asked if I could get my friends out but without any arguing or words I was king-hit before a group of guys came out of the club and dragged me around the corner and kicked my head in."

Mr Page remained in a serious but stable condition in the intensive care unit of a Gold Coast hospital yesterday.

THESE are some of the stories about bully-boy bouncers you sent to The Daily Telegraph's website after our special report:

From Warwick Smith:
"Last night I went to a gig at a local live music venue. A guy was drunk and started causing some embarrassment to himself, so the bouncers threw him down the stairs.
After the gig he was still outside and the bouncer thumped him. The guy was half the size of the bouncer and was not causing any problems."

From Christopher Young, Ambulance officer:
"I see too often bouncers stirring up pub-goers. They seem to be very good at doing it the wrong way — aggressive, antagonistic and intimidating. If they kept their mouths shut the pub-goer would more than likely leave."

From Sean Robinson:
"My friend was caught in the toilets coughing. A bouncer grabbed him, my friend went, 'I was coughing' and the bouncer said, 'Bulls... you threw him down stairs. He couldn't move one side of his body for a week.'"

From Shane Bruner:
"In the US, club owners and security staff are focused on meeting customers' needs, rather than dismissing or assaulting them as often happens here."
